Working within marine timetables, scheduling work to not disrupt traffic, and working in a marine environment close to water involving maximum safety requirements, heights and a lifesaver were some of the specialised aspects of this project. JAK Civil worked with other contractors on the high-pressure removal of the existing deck.
